NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Sammamish received an application on October 12, 2018 for planning improvements to Issaquah-Fall City Road from 242nd Ave SE to Issaquah-Beaver Lake Road that will add capacity and improve safety. With over 1,800 vehicles per hour traveling along the roadway during peak periods, and few alternate routes, Issaquah-Fall City Road is one of the most highly used roads in the area. The current shape and slope of the roadway can create difficult sight lines for drivers, pedestrians and cyclists. Roadway improvements are needed to reduce congestion and improve safety for all users. Roadway design and construction will be done in two phases. Phase I is from 242nd Ave SE to Klahanie Drive SE. Phase II is from Klahanie Drive SE to Issaquah-Beaver Lake Road. Roadway improvements will be balanced with the City's commitment to protect mature trees and environmentally sensitive areas, where possible. The bridge, which will replace the existing culvert, improves wildlife habitat and passage for migrating salmon and other fish. The City will continue to work with the community and appropriate agencies to ensure that roadway improvements are made while minimizing impacts to natural areas, and important fish and wildlife habitats.

In accordance with SMC 20.05.060, on October 29, 2018 the City issued this Notice of Application by the following means: mailed notice to property owners within 1,000 feet of the subject site, a sign posted on the subject site, and by placing a legal notice in the local newspaper.
