<b>Addendum:</b>	This is a SEPA addendum to an issued DNS (10/31/2014). The original DNS was issued by the City of Sammamish for a comprehensive plan amendment which included replacement of school impact fees for the three school districts. The current proposal does not substantially change the analysis of significant impacts and alternatives in the existing environmental document.
