



The City's Commitment to You

The City will continue serving the Inglewood streets it has historically served, including:

- Snow and ice removal
- Vegetation and debris management
- Pothole repair
- City permitting
- Parking enforcement
- Etc.

No change to non-City services such as mail and package delivery, solid waste pickup and more.






Findings: Most City-Maintained Streets are Publicly Owned

Most of the historically served streets in Inglewood are clearly public streets, not private.

- Shown in green on the map.
- Most of these streets were constructed, deeded and dedicated by private property owners, and accepted into the County road system by resolution, in 1965.
- Other segments were deeded to the County later by other property owners.
- City received ownership upon incorporation in 1999.



Findings: Some City-Maintained Streets are Still Being Evaluated

A few streets are still being evaluated on a property-byproperty level, and we may find deeds or dedication documents associated with these short segments.

- Shown in yellow on the map.
- If no public information is found on the segments in yellow, the City will work with each property owner individually to identify a permanent solution.
- The City will continue serving these streets regardless of whether information is found.
- These property owners received a separate, mailed letter.




The City's Commitment to You

Memorializing that the Streets are Public

One option is for City Council to adopt a resolution containing all context and findings in one document for future reference, including:

- Background on the plat;
- Types of services the City has provided since incorporation;
- Statements that the historically-served streets are public and the City will continue to serve them; and
- Acknowledgement of the unique nature of Inglewood's streets and a commitment to develop appropriate Public Works Standards.
 - What kind of language do you want to see in the resolution?
 - Is there anything we're missing?

How to prevent this from happening again?

The City is creating standard operating procedures (SOPs) that include a list of property research sites to review if an issue like this happens again.

- Moving forward, each of the following sites must be comprehensively searched:
 - King County Map Vault
 - King County Archives
 - King County Assessor's Maps
 - King County Auditor Records

Planning for the Future

The City would like to collaborate on Public Works Street Standards that maintain Inglewood's character.

- Street Standards contain specifications for the design, construction, and maintenance of public rights-of-way.
- Work on Street Standards commence this fall.
- Desire to develop Inglewood-specific standards that recognize the unique nature of the neighborhood's streets.

Planning for the Future

We want to hear your voice in other planning projects, including:

- Draft 2026-2031 Citywide Capital Improvement Plan
 - Inglewood Hill Sidewalk Gap Project
- Pavement Management Strategic Plan (in progress)
 - Pavement mapping is being completed on all public streets including Inglewood's as a part of this plan
- Bike & Pedestrian Mobility Plan (will be completed in Q4 2025)
- Public Works Standards & Right-of-Way Code Update (in progress)
- Strategic Streetlight Enhancement Plan (in progress)
- Transportation Master Plan 2026 Update (in progress)
