

In 2020, Washington Native Plant Stewards, City staff and volunteers began to transform a 1-acre section of East Sammamish Park into an open, diverse and resilient native forest. They removed many truckloads of Himalayan blackberry and other invasive plants and replaced them with over 1,000 native trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants.



Stewards mapped existing vegetation and created a restoration plan to reduce invasive plant cover, enhance native species richness, and encourage community engagement. The diverse plant community will attract pollinators and provide habitat for wildlife. Birds, Pacific tree frogs, deer, and bobcats have been observed visiting this section of the park. The added tree canopy will enhance air quality by reducing carbon dioxide. The renewed forest will filter and decrease stormwater runoff.
