

Mural Girl Scout Troop 45370 Sammamish Commons 2021



Proposal for Girl Scout Mural at the Upper Sammamish Commons

Sammamish Girl Scout Troop #45370, made up of 11 5th grade girls from Mead and Blackwell Elementary Schools, proposes to paint a mural at the Upper Sammamish Commons play structure in an effort to complete their <u>Bronze Award</u>. They are excited to be able to bring a bit more color and life into the world as well.

Location:

The proposed project is to be painted along the wall behind the play structure across from the library, running parallel to 228th Ave SE. See below picture. The size of the wall is 42' x 10' 4" (~462 square feet).



Cost/Materials:

Mural will be painted with <u>Sherwin Williams Pro-Park Waterborne Traffic Marking Paint</u>. This is an exterior paint that adheres well to concrete. Use of this paint requires no additional varnish to be applied for color-fastness or cleaning purposes.

The cost of paint and supplies is anticipated to be around \$300.

Supplies:

5 gallons of paint (white, black, blue, red, yellow); additional colors to be mixed

5 @ \$48.49 = \$242.45

Various paint brushes, drop clothes, etc.

Preparation:

Prior to painting, the troop will power wash the surface and apply chalk outlines. Power washing would occur two days to one week before painting. Painting portion is expected to require two weeks to complete and is expected to be done in June 2020.

Care would be exercised to keep the playground structure, grass, and adjacent walls paint free through the use of drop cloths, paper, tape, and careful painting methods.

Clean up:

No additional cleanup would be required by grounds crews upon troop exit.

Design:

Below is the initial design for the mural. The size is to scale.





The project had to get several approvals. They showed their video to the Sammamish Arts Commission. Then several girls answered questions from the SAC







Sammamish has a new mural greeting visitors at Sammamish Commons. This mural started as a Bronze Award project for the girls in Troop 45370. The Bronze Award is the highest award that a Girl Scout can achieve in 4th and 5th grade. The mural plans were presented for approval to the Arts Commission, the Parks Commission and the City Council in early 2020 by the 11 girls in the Troop. They were all 5th graders at the time. COVID paused the plans (and they found another socially distanced project to complete their Bronze Award), but the girls, now going into 7th grade, were very happy to be able to complete the mural this summer.

The girls worked together to choose the design. When asked about the phrase "You Do You", most of the girls talked about the importance of being themselves and being proud of who they are as individuals.

This mural and message is a great representation of the talent and value youth of Sammamish share with the community every day.
