Description of proposal:

The Department of Community Development is proposing amendments to the Parks Element of the Comprehensive Plan. The purpose of the amendments is to ensure that the Comprehensive Plan reflects the latest data, goals, and policies included in the Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Plan that was adopted by City Council in 2018.

Proponent: City of Sammamish, Department of Community Development

Location of proposal: The proposed amendments will apply only within the corporate boundaries of the City.


